

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Michigan-Shiga High School Exchange is a program that grew out of the strong sister-state relationship between the State of Michigan and Shiga Prefecture that was established in 1968. Hundreds of Michigan high school students have traveled to Japan and hosted their Japanese friends since the high school exchange began in 1990, contributing to the mutual understanding and appreciation that exists between our two states and countries.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS



JUNE/JULY

15 Michigan students* travel to Shiga and stay with a host family for 2 weeks, experiencing Japanese school and daily life.



*Students are accompanied by 2 adult chaperones

AUG/SEPT

The 15 Shiga students who hosted come to stay with their Michigan student and her/his family for 2 weeks and attend school.

ELIGIBILITY

- Students currently in 9th, 10th, or 11th grade in Michigan may apply.
- Applicants and their families should be open-minded, flexible, and willing to accept new challenges.
- Students must have a valid passport or obtain one no later than May 3, 2019.
- To be considered, students must submit their completed application by the deadline, March 8, 2019.

PROGRAM CONSIDERATIONS

- Selected students and at least one parent/guardian must attend the orientation in East Lansing.
- Applicants and their families must be able to host their Shiga student for two weeks in August/September (including attending the welcome and farewell events in Lansing).
- The high school that the applicant attends must be willing to welcome a Japanese student and allow her/him to attend classes for two weeks.
- For applicants, previous study of Japanese language is helpful, but is not required.

/2019 Orientation for selected candidates and parents/guardians at Michigan State University

April 15 participants and ~5 alternates will be selected and notified

6/26/2019 Michigan students travel to Japan, stay with their Shiga student and family, and attend school

7/13/2019 Michigan students return to Michigan

8/29/2019 Michigan families pick up their Shiga student at a welcome event in Lansing and the homestay begins

9/14/2019 The homestay ends and Michigan families and their Shiga student attend a farewell event in Lansing
