

Japanese Language & Culture Programs



JCMU Japanese Language and Culture programs run throughout the year and offer beginner (first year) through advanced (fourth year) level Japanese in an intensive format. Students will complete an academic year's worth of college-level Japanese per term, while also immersing themselves in Japanese life and the local community!

Students participating in the fall or spring semester terms (or a full academic year) take elective courses in addition to their Japanese language classes.

Coursework

Intensive Japanese Language (10 Credits)

Level 1 (beginner) through Level 4** (advanced)

Daily instruction addresses listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Placement is based on exams held at the beginning of the program.

Electives (4-5 Credits)

JCMU Experience (required; 1 cr.) + Elective Choice (3-4 cr.)

Course options vary by semester. See website for recent or upcoming options.

NOTE: Students can apply to participate in a full academic year (Fall + Spring)

Semester students also have the option of participating in a Professional Development Project (PDP) where they will be paired with a local business, school, or other organization for hands-on work experience.

**Level 4 (advanced) students have an academic internship integrated into their elective course, along with advanced Japanese coursework with a professional focus.








JCMU Housing & Facilities

JCMU campus, located right on the shore of Lake Biwa, consists of the Academic Building and the Residence Hall.



JCMU's Residence Hall offers double-occupancy apartments (and a wheelchair-accessible single room), each equipped with private bedroom(s), a kitchen, and a bathroom. Kitchens come equipped with a stove, sink, refrigerator, and several appliances.

JCMU campus is located outside of downtown Hikone. Students are provided with bicycles* to help get around the area. Distances to various Hikone locations include:

■ <.25 mi Coco's and other local restaurants ■ 0.8 mi Convenience store (with ATM) ■ 1.6 mi Grocery store, cafés / restaurants ■ 1.7 mi Shiga University & Hikone Castle ■ 2.4 mi Hikone Train Station

JCMU is located in Hikone, a city of approximately 100,000 people in Shiga Prefecture situated on the eastern shore of Lake Biwa, the largest lake in Japan.


